But after the meeting, Andreas succeeds in capturing Saborios' emissary and takes a fitting revenge. Sergios' genitals are cut off and he is tied to a pole. Andreas is also known for his capture of the important fortress of Amorion from the Arabs in the winter AD 668-69, killing a defence force of 5000. Several identifications have been offered for the obverse figure and the object he is holding. Most probable perhaps is the interpretation offered by the editors of the Hecht col. catalogue. They identify the rider as Andreas koubikoularios himself, in the guise of imperial mandator or messenger. The object in his hand must be the message, a roll inside a cylindrical receptacle.
